Abstract:

This talk introduces the speaker's personal experience of Japanese architecture from travelling and architectural study tours organized for the CUHK School of Architecture in the summer of 2013 and 2014. Citing examples from the 7th century to modern day Japan, the speaker will discuss relationships between the architecture and its context, making reference to selected literature on the subject. Through this short talk the speaker, as a practicing architect, will provide an insightful introduction to this fascinating subject.

Mr. Yutaka Yano read architecture at University College London and is Adjunct Assistant Professor at the School of Architecture, CUHK.
